'the ' or not 'the'....?

1. Prison , hospital, college, church:

He went to prison 3 years agoAnn has gone to the prison to visit her
fatherIn the US school is over at 3.30The school is a mile from hereDavid is in hospitalMelanie waited at the hospital for newsShe goes to church on SundaysWe looked round the church, but it was
closed

\Rightarrow 'the' is used when we talk about a specific building.

2. Note the following expressions:

In bed; to go to bed	To sit on the bed; to make the bed
At home; to go home	In the house
At sea; to go to sea	By the sea
In town (NB: downtown)	In the town centre, in the city, village
At work	In the office
Breakfast is served in the kitchen	The breakfast was very good

3. 'The' is not used for general (generic) meanings, uncountable nouns (notions):

Cars are great polluters. I like music. Irish history is fascinating. Society is going through a crisis.

Exc: The Germans oppose the idea of military strikes. (nationalities) ('Germans': also possible).

Note: Room 105, page 78, chapter 2, World War II (+numbers)

4. 'The' is used for specific meanings:

We saw the elephants at the zoo The music was too loud The history of Ireland is fascinating (NB: Irish history) The novel as a genre emerged in the 18th century.

5. Special uses of 'the':

- The tiger is an endangered species (species). *Note:* Man is a dangerous animal.
- The Internet is a prodigious invention. (modern technological inventions) exc.: They saw the tsunami on TV (but: they bought a new TV *object*.)
- She plays the flute ('the' with musical instruments, not for sports: she plays tennis).
- The poor/ the rich/ the homeless... (*adjectives turned into nouns*)
- The beautiful (id) (concept)
- The English like their queen. (id) (nationals)



- 6. 'The' is used when there is only <u>one</u> of the things we are talking about:
- planets: the earth; the moon; here comes the sun (NB: Jupiter, Mars)
- the government, the Prime Minister, the President, the Queen (NB: President Bush; Queen Elisabeth II here the person is named)
- the environment, the ozone layer (but: nature, society = concepts)
- the police (are), the army, the church, the family, the media, the press: *institutions*

7. <u>Place names</u>: roads, streets, squares, parks, cities, countries ...

- Most place names do not have 'the': Oxford Street, Fifth Avenue, Central Park, New Orleans, California, Europe.
- But: The United States is a big country. He lives in the Bahamas. The Irish republic, the United Kingdom: 'the' is used with country names which are a combination of various common names, or plural names, or words like 'republic' and 'kingdom'. He has left the Riviera for the Middle East. 'The' is used with regions. Exc.: The Hague, The Bronx, The Mall, the London road (the road to London), the M6, the A5 (numbered roads).

Theatres, museums, cinemas have 'the': The Globe; the Tate; The Plaza.

8. "The" is used in front of **seas and oceans, rivers, mountain ranges**.

The Mediterranean and the Atlantic Ocean, the Rhône, the Himalaya.

But "The" is not used with lakes (Lake Michigan) or single mountains (Mount Everest).

9. **The** ... **of:** *The Importance of Being Earnest* is a play by Oscar Wilde. NB: We do not use 'the' with a possessive: John's country house.

A, an

1. an/a

'a' is used with words beginning with a consonant (a history book), 'an' with words beginning with a vowel.

BUT:

- A university, a ewe, a euphemism ("u sound")
- An hour, an honest man, an heir, an honourable agreement ('h' is not pronounced) NB: half an hour; a quarter of an hour
- An MP, an FBI agent

2. Note the specific use of a:

She is a student at Imperial College. She works as a researcher. They can't live without a car. What a great film! It's such a great film.

- 3. **A / one:**
- He gave his son a sweet # He gave him one sweet (a unique sweet).
- He won a/one hundred dollars, a/one thousand pounds...
- One day/ one evening/ one night somebody rang at the door.
- The salesman went from one house to another.
